MCKINNISS

There is a good deal in a NAME. The Name we want to perpetuate was brought to us across the "Briny Deep" from Scotland, where many of the name still live, by a soldier in Braddock's army of 2,000 men. It was Braddock who reached the Monongahela river in Pennsylvania on July 8th, 1755. Disregarding the advice of Washington and other frontiersmen, he pushed on, next day, to invest Fort Duquesne, at the junction of that river and the Allegheny. In a two-hour hard fought battle with 900 French and Indians Braddock was defeated and mortally wounded. He died at "Great Meadows" on July 13th. In that battle the valiant and brave soldier, Charles McKinnis, was shot through, wounded in the left side and thigh. This is the pivotal point on which hung the destiny of our name, the name that so many of us cherish. Thanks to that All-seeing Eye of our Heavenly Father, the soldier survived. Had the wounds proven fatal. I would not be penning these lines, upholding a name, a household word, in so many homes in nearly every state in the Union. This soldier, our great grandfather "was honorably discharged for bravery and wounds with rank of captain and given a charter for several leagues of land in Nova Scotia." He was born near Bona Bornia, between Edinburg and Glasgow, Scotland, in 1722; at the age of 22 he was impressed into the British army, his regiment was the Grenadiers. At the age of 50 he was married to Rachel Carr, in Pennsylvania. To them were born nine children: William, born in 1773; Robert, 1777, died in 1863; Charles, born 1780, died in 1837; Joseph; George, born 1783, died 1857; Margaret, born 1785, died about 1850; John, born 1788, died 1864; a daughter, lived about 2½ years; James, born 1794, died 1858.

When great grandfather, Charles Mc-

Kinnis, died in 1806, his papers were placed in the hands of Squire Skull and kept in a two bushel pine box; mice entered through a knot hole and destroyed the land charter and other papers. Charles and Rachel McKinniss were buried in Butler Cemetery, Butler, Butler county, Pa., and have grey tombstones. (Note: The bodies were all removed from this cemetery to the "North Cemetery" to make room for a public school building, and as yet the graves are not located.)

We have no definite knowledge of William and Joseph. It will be useless to follow each branch of this great family in detail as the following pages will furnish more meat for study for those interested; but we cannot close this article without mentioning some of the most striking characteristics of the members of this interesting family. There seems to have been and still predominates a prepotency in the blood of the clan; and to describe one in a general way would be an index to the whole family. As one of the clan said to the writer, "The impression I have formed is this that farmers predominate, then follow miners, teachers, doctors and merchants, with no one in the liquor trade, or criminals, no dependents, all work for good government, and few care for political preferment, and the highest ambition of all is to have a happy home and to know their children are reared in the way they should go. We have some contractors and managers, but few lawyers, while as a family we are law abiding citizens, detesting litigations and wrangling; all recognizing our Heavenly Father's guidance. And may our posterity keep up the good name given us by that Scottish Soldier, and may our Star never grow dim until the "Perfect Day."

The following Historical Sketch, except a few revisions, was read at the Sixth Annual Reunion at Electric Park, Jackson county, Ohio, by the Historian, G. E. Scott:

Mr. President: It will be remembered that at the last reunion the writer was selected to collect any available data relative to the family history. What I have written are, for the most part familiar facts to most all of us but it is tendered in the belief that all who attend the reunion may not be familiar with the earlier efforts of our fore-parents.

The McKinnis family is now a numerous and widely scattered clan, but only a little more than a century ago it was represented only by the members of the household of three of Jackson county's most prominent pioneers, Charles McKinnis, the grandfather of Charles W. McKinnis, of Coalton, was born in 1780 in Pennsylvania, and in 1802 emigrated to Chillicothe, Ohio, accompanied by his wife and family, and also his brothers, Robert and George, and their families.

Their trip over was quite adventurous and well worthy of mention. Robert made the journey overland from Butler county, Penn., but prior to his departure the brothers felled a large pine tree on the banks of Beaver Creek, Butler County, and from its trunk fashioned a very commodious canoe, of such size, it is said, that the family flour barrel was stowed crosswise in the stern during the trip down the Ohio. The canoe was floated down the creek and the Allegheny River to Pittsburgh where Charles loaded his family and all their possessions and proceeded down the Ohio River to what is now Portsmouth, where they were met by the brother, Robert, and with the assistance of his arm and rifle they safely made the rest of their journey to Chillicothe.

Chillicothe at that time was one of the few military posts in the new state of Ohio, and the brothers made livelihood by raising corn and other agriculture products for sale to the government for the garrison. However, the entire family suffered severely from malaria and ague, and shortly moved to Jackson county, taking residence at the old McKinniss homestead north of Coalton. This site was selected on account of its proximity to the sulphur springs on the old farm, discovered by my great-grandfather on one of his hunting trips, and to the beneficial effects of these waters he attributed the cure of the entire family from the fevers that troubled them while on the Scioto.

At that time Indians still roamed in this vicinity, and these resident bands took a great fancy to Joe, the small son of the family, the father of L. W. McKinniss, and Mrs. L. H. Tripp, who lived at Hamden. So pressing were their attentions that Mrs. McKinniss, becoming alarmed, induced the pioneer to move back again, nearer the protection of the garrison at Chillicothe. This they did, and again engaged in agricultural pursuits, raising corn and stock. They were not only able to raise enough for their own needs, and to sell to the garrison, but engaged in the New Orleans trade with profit, transporting corn and pork by flat-boat during the rises of the Scioto down the Ohio, and thence via the Mississippi to the gulf.

Charles again took residence at the homestead in Coal township, building the nucleus of what became of the old farm home with which most of us associate fond memories of happy times. This home was destroyed by fire about 1897, and was situated near the present Thornhill residence on the Coalton-Byer Pike.

While conducting an extensive farming business, he still employed a portion of his time in the river business as pilot of flat-boats in the Ohio and Mississippi trade, and the cause of his death, March 29th, 1837, was directly traceable to a strain received while "shooting the rapids" at Louisville. While he lost his life in the service, it is a fact that he never lost a boat on these rapids, the most dangerous portion of

the whole route from Portsmouth to New Orleans.

In our research concerning the wife of Charles McKinniss we were successful in locating reliable data. She was Martha Craner, born 1778, died August 8, 1864, a grand-daughter of Robert Fulton, Sr., who was born in Kilkerry, Ireland about 1669. Hence our Scotch-Irishness. The aforementioned Robert Fulton, in early manhood emigrated to the American Colonies and settled near Lancaster, Penna., and married Mary Smith, the daughter of a respected family among the numerous Smiths of eastern Pennsylvania, a girl also of Irish descent, and to them were born, besides your (C.C.'s) great grandmother, your great great uncle, Robert Fulton, Jr., and another son and two daughters. This man Robert Fulton, Jr., you will remember exploited the first steam boat, the first mechanical dredge, the first torpedo, the first successful submarine boat—The Nautilus of Historic fame—and several other useful inventions. He was a civil engineer of world renown, and Napoleon once said as he stood on the bleak rocks of St. Helena, watching the smoke from a steamer's funnel on the horizon: "I see now that it was I not Fulton, who was crazy. Had I accepted his proposition to equip our warships with steam power, I would not be here." He referred to a time during the Anglo-French wars when Fulton wanted to install in the service steam driven vessels.

But I am getting off my subject. Our Miss Fulton, Robert's sister married Chas. Craner, and their daughter in turn married Charles McKinniss, the Ohio pioneer, and the prominent feature of this sketch. The names of their children are familiar to us all, being Craner, Joseph, Clarissa, Nancy, George, Philip, Charles, Robert, Granville and Rachel.

The following sketch by Alice Groves of Findlay, Ohio:

History tells us that Judge Robert McKinniss was born in Butler county, Pa., and was of Scotch-Irish descent. He removed thence to Ross county, O., and from thence in 1821, he came to Hancock county, Ohio, where he at once became one of the leading men. He married Elizabeth Craner, niece of Robert Fulton, before his immigration to

Ohio, and was surrounded by a grown up family when he came to this county.

Judge Robert McKinniss, who with Abraham Huff and Ebenezer Wilson, were the first associate judges on the bench in Hancock county, holding court in 1823, with Ebenezer Lane as presiding judge. He was Liberty township's first settler, having immigrated to this county with his son Charles, entering land in Liberty township December 20, 1821.

The first settlement in the county was made in the spring of 1821 by Jacob Poe and in the fall by Robert McKinniss and his sons Charles, James, Philip and John. Charles McKinniss was a member of the first Grand Jury called by the County Court also one of the first County Commissioners. He was one of the County Commissioners in 1829 when the "Old Town Episode" happened in which the then Findlay township was separated from Wood county and resulted in the first County suit for damages. Charles was a native of Pennsylvania and his wife, Mary Vail, was a native of Virginia, being of Scotch-Irish descent. He died November 21, 1864, aged 67 years, 11 months, and 2 days. His wife, Mary Vail McKinniss, died September 11, 1869, aged 68 years, 4 months, and 5 days.

Judge Robert McKinniss and wife, Elizabeth, Charles McKinniss and wife Mary, and sons, Robert, Thomas, Philip and wives and John are buried in the Worden Cemetery six miles west of Findlay on the North River Road. Elizabeth Ewing and Mary Ann Collingwood and husband are buried in the cemetery at McComb, Ohio.

George McKinniss lived near his brother Charles on what is now the Wilson Lively farm north of Coalton, Ohio, he and wife Permelia Hinkle were buried at Byer, O.

Margaret and husband, John Dick and John McKinniss and wife Jane Pillow, were all born, lived, died and were buried in Pennsylvania.

James McKinniss and wife Margaret Times were born in Pennsylvania. Moved to Putnam county, Ohio, then to Marion county, Iowa, in 1853. James was buried one mile northeast of Knoxville, Iowa; Margaret was buried one mile from Oakley, Iowa.
